At Scholars Unlimited, we believe that every child deserves to see themselves in the books they read. Each year, we thoughtfully select books that not only align with our summer curriculum but also celebrate the rich diversity of our scholars.

Representation matters, and we intentionally choose authors and stories that honor the identities, experiences, and cultures of the children we serve—books that spark joy, curiosity, and a love of reading.

This past summer, our intermediate-level scholars embarked on an adventure with Let the Monster Out by Chad Lucas. Through this engaging story, our scholars explored themes of friendship, facing fears, and the power of embracing our differences. The novel encouraged rich discussions about self-acceptance and resilience while allowing our scholars to see themselves reflected in the pages. For our primary learners, we selected a collection of books that centered on self-expression, emotions, and identity:

- Where the Wild Things Are by Maurice Sendak A timeless classic that invites children to navigate emotions and imagination.
- A Place Inside of Me by Zetta Elliott A powerful exploration of emotions, identity, and self-love.
- Too Much: An Overwhelming Day by Jolene Gutierrez A beautifully inclusive story about sensory experiences and embracing who we are.

Adding to the excitement, author Jolene Gutierrez visited our scholars, bringing the magic of storytelling to life. Her presence reinforced the importance of literacy, representation, and the joy found in books that truly resonate with young readers. At the heart of our work, we strive to recognize, honor, and celebrate each scholar's unique gifts. This summer's book selections encouraged our scholars to embrace their identities, see their experiences reflected in meaningful ways, and discover the joy of reading stories that truly speak to them.

Scholars Unlimited had another successful year serving ten schools and 913 scholars. Seventy percent of our scholars are considered regular attendees. Scholars Unlimited also engaged with 647 unique addresses across the Denver Metro region. Scholars participated in literacy intervention and enrichment programs, including physical wellness, break dancing, hula hooping, SEL through drama, and so much more.



We will host Scholars Unlimited Celebratory Gala and Fundraiser on Friday, June 13th and the Denver Botanic Gardens. Save the date!


