Letter from the CEO

Dear Friends, Supporters, and Community Members,

As I reflect on this extraordinary year at Scholars Unlimited, I am reminded of the profound truth that has guided our work for over three decades: Joy is revolutionary. In a world where educational inequities persist and federal budget cuts threaten the very programs our children depend on, we refuse to be led by fear. Instead, we are led by joy—joy in the decisions we make, the relationships we build, and the lives we continue to transform through our work.

This year, that revolutionary joy has been evident in every corner of our programs. When 88% of our after-school scholars report that Scholars Unlimited made them better readers, I see joy in discovery. When 92% share that they feel more confident in themselves, I witness joy in self-realization. When a parent tells us, "My daughter was not reading prior to camp and is leaving with being able to sound out words and successfully read books. Her confidence is through the roof," I experience the revolutionary power of joy in learning.

This year brought unprecedented challenges. Budget cuts threatened more than 70% of our funding, forcing us to make difficult decisions while never compromising our commitment to our scholars and families. Yet even in uncertainty, we discovered that our foundation—built on authentic relationships, culturally responsive programming, and unwavering belief in every child's potential—remains unshakeable.

To our dedicated staff, committed board members, generous supporters, and resilient families: thank you for believing in the revolutionary power of joy. Thank you for standing with us, especially when the odds seemed against us. Together, we have created spaces where children don't just survive but thrive.

Joy is revolutionary. And we are just getting started.

Scholars After School

Where learning becomes joyful and every voice matters

Building Bridges Between School and Home

Scholars After School transforms the critical hours after the school day ends into a time of discovery, growth, and connection. Operating within the familiar walls of partner schools across metro Denver, our comprehensive program serves 427 scholars across 10 school sites and 4 districts, creating safe havens where children don't just receive academic support. They find joy in learning. Our approach combines evidence-based literacy intervention with



hands-on STEM exploration, social-emotional learning, and enrichment activities that honor the diverse backgrounds of the families we serve.

Mental Health Initiative: Healing Through Connection

Recognizing that academic growth and emotional well-being are inseparable, Scholars After School launched a mental health initiative in partnership with MSU Denver's School of Social Work. Graduate-level social work interns are embedded within programming, providing both individual and group mental health support directly within the trusted environment of after-school sites. This groundbreaking approach addresses Colorado's critical shortage of mental health providers while providing trauma-informed care and social-emotional support as a natural part of the daily experience.

Voice and Choice: Scholars as Partners

Central to our philosophy is the belief that children are experts on their own experiences. Throughout our programming, scholars exercise voice and choice in their learning journey. From selecting enrichment activities to advocating for program improvements, students shape their own educational experience. Staff document and respond to scholar requests, whether it's organizing recycling projects, choosing movement activities, or suggesting new learning themes. During family celebration events, scholars take the lead in presenting their accomplishments and sharing what they've discovered, demonstrating true ownership of their growth.

This approach builds self-advocacy skills that extend far beyond our program walls, preparing students to navigate educational systems with confidence and purpose.


Six weeks of joyful learning, endless possibilities

When Summer Means Growth, Not Loss

While many children experience learning loss during summer months, Summer Scholars creates the opposite effect: 308 scholars across 3 different school districts engaged in intensive, full-day programming that blended academic growth with the pure joy of discovery. With an impressive 80% attendance rate, our six-week summer program proved that when learning is culturally responsive, relationship-centered, and fun, children choose to show up.



Culturally Responsive Literature: Barely Floating



Understanding that representation matters, Summer Scholars 2025 centered around "Barely Floating" by Lilliam Rivera, a powerful novel featuring Natalia, a proud Latina swimmer navigating body positivity, family expectations, and finding her voice. This intentional book selection reflects our commitment to ensuring BIPOC children see themselves as protagonists in the stories they read.

Recognizing that BIPOC children are represented in less than 24% of all children's books as lead characters, we deliberately choose literature that honors our scholars' experiences. Through Natalia's journey, scholars explored themes of identity development, self-advocacy, and cultural pride, themes that resonated deeply with their own experiences of growing up in multiple cultural contexts. The novel became a launching point for creative writing projects, identity exploration activities, and discussions about resilience and belonging.

Summer Scholars

Experiential Learning Through Community Partnerships

Summer Scholars came alive through partnerships that brought learning beyond classroom walls through intentional opportunities for scholars to practice social skills and explore new environments.

Movement and Wellness with Vive Wellness

We were proud to partner with Vive Wellness, a local, Latina-led organization that brings energy, movement, and culturally responsive programming to our enrichment sessions. Through fun activities and positive adult relationships, scholars developed confidence, joy, and a sense of belonging, outcomes that last well beyond the program day.

Field Trip Adventures

Field trips connected scholars to experiences and spaces across our community, from the Denver Museum of Nature & Science and the Denver Zoo to Warrior Challenge, swimming adventures, and more. These outings sparked joy and curiosity while providing access to opportunities many scholars might not otherwise experience.

Family Engagement: Celebrating Together

Families are partners in every child's success, and we honor the cultural wealth that families bring while creating opportunities for connection.

Scholars Showcase: The summer culminated in a "Scholars Showcase" where scholar-led gallery walks. Families were active participants, asking questions, and witnessing their children's confidence in action.

Multilingual Communication: All family communications are provided in both English and Spanish, with staff receiving compensation for translation services rather than expecting unpaid labor. This approach ensures language is never a barrier to engagement.

Cultural Celebration: Programming incorporates community storytelling and cultural traditions, creating opportunities for families to see their knowledge honored as curriculum rather than overlooked or marginalized.



(August 1, 2024-July 31, 2025)





In 2024–25, we received \$1.88 million in revenue, including more than \$1.3 million from grants and over \$430,000 from contributions and community support. We invested \$1.63 million directly into programs, ensuring our after-school and summer opportunities stayed strong, joyful, and impactful.

As expected, we closed the year with a deficit, a reflection of ongoing post-COVID realities and shifts in district funding, but used our \$1.5 million in beginning assets to maintain uninterrupted programming. With your continued support, we expect to return to balanced operations in 2025–26. Together, we are proving that joy is revolutionary.
